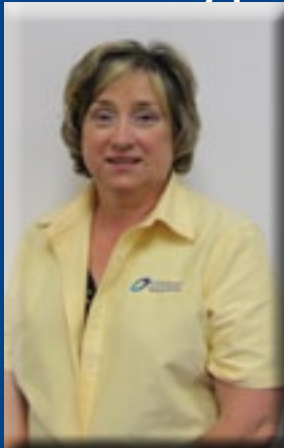

Aging and Disability Resource Center

The ADRC is a trusted place where people can turn for information on a full range of long-term support options. As such, it provides an enhanced level of information and assistance/referral to the community improving their ability to make informed choices. Options Counselors focus on individual needs and preferences by providing information/assistance and referral to persons seeking solutions to their specific long-term care issues. **5,168 contacts were made through the ADRC. 1,502 were for Options Counseling via telephone or in person.**

Care Management

LifeSpan Resources serves as the single entry point into a variety of supportive services for frail older persons and individuals with disabilities who have multiple health care needs. The Care Manager helps identify needs and links persons with home and community-based services so they may remain in the community. **Care Management and Screenings totaled 154,678 units.**

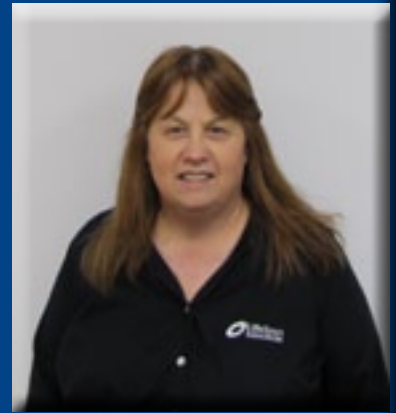

Not only has she seen the agency morph from the South Central Indiana Council for the Aging and Aged Inc. to its current day LifeSpan Resources, she has witnessed many program changes that have brought us to where we are today. According to Earlene, "I enjoy the agency's mission to support the elderly and disabled people in our area and the caring attitude of my co-workers. It makes feel good to know that what I do, as part of a team, helps to improve someone else's life." Earlene is also the Coordinator for the Senior Citizens Angel Tree and served as Secretary for March 2 Recovery Steering Committee, the long-term recovery organization benefitting those affected by the March 2nd tornadoes.



Advocacy

Our agency represents senior citizens through membership in the Human Services Associations and state and national legislative networks. It also sponsors the Golden Hoosier Award, Senior Angel Tree and Senior Games of Indiana. In 2010 the agency launched an Advocacy Committee whose purpose is to act on legislation that affects the elderly and disabled population and/or the agency and its programs.



342 individuals participated in Senior Games and 421 clients were assisted through the Senior Citizens Angel Tree.

Nutrition Program

Provides a hot mid-day meal Monday through Friday to older adults at congregate nutrition sites. Homebound clients receive a frozen 7 pack of meals. **In 2014 we served a total of 193,423 meals: 48,319 Congregate Meals and 145,104 home delivered meals.**

Preventative Health

Provides monthly health screenings at nutrition sites and periodic educational programs on health topics. **2,213**

contacts were made through Health Screenings and Education last year.

Outreach

Provides information and assistance services to older persons in Scott County. Staff assist with accessing services and programs including public benefits. **Outreach totaled 505 contacts.**



Health Facility Pre-Admission Screening

Mandated by state law, this program helps prevent unnecessary placement in nursing homes of individuals whose long-term care needs can best be met by community services in their own homes. **2,965 applications were processed.**

Legal Services

Our agency funds an attorney who provides legal assistance to persons age 60 and over. **283 hours (Pro-Bono included) in Legal Services provided.**

Transportation

Furnishes transportation to medical appointments, nutrition sites, social service organizations and other locations for persons age 60+ and persons with disabilities. The program is a Medicaid provider for individuals of all ages. **Transportation provided 24,258 trips last year.**

In-Home Services

The In-Home Services Program provides at risk older persons and persons with disabilities with an array of services to enable them to live independently. Eligibility varies based on funding sources utilized. Care management, attendant care, home delivered meals, adult day care, respite care, homemaker, home health aide, transportation, minor home modifications and adaptive aids and devices are among services provided. **In-Home Services provided 166,098 units last year.**

Family Caregiver Program

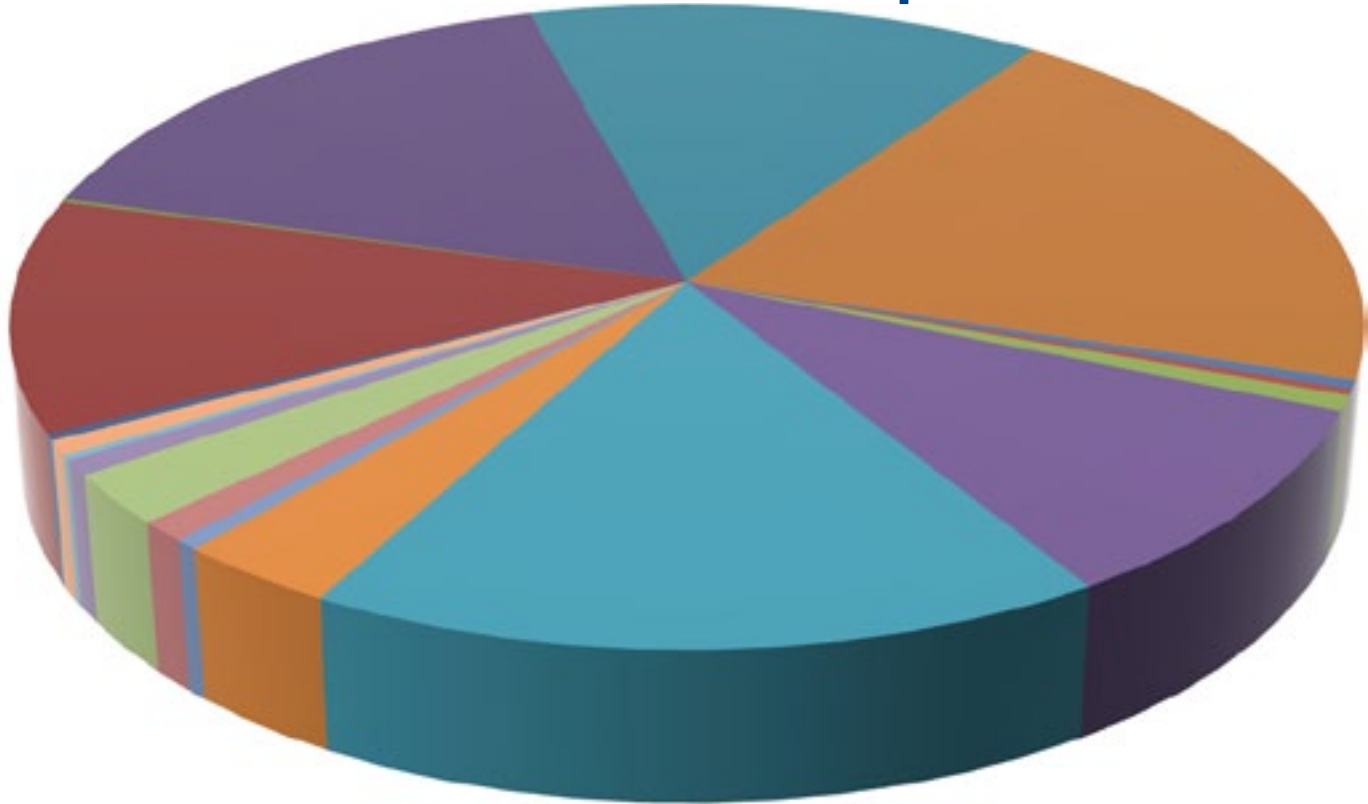
Connects caregivers to community resources particular to their caregiving needs including Respite Care and other supportive services. **In 2014 the program made 6,828 contacts.**

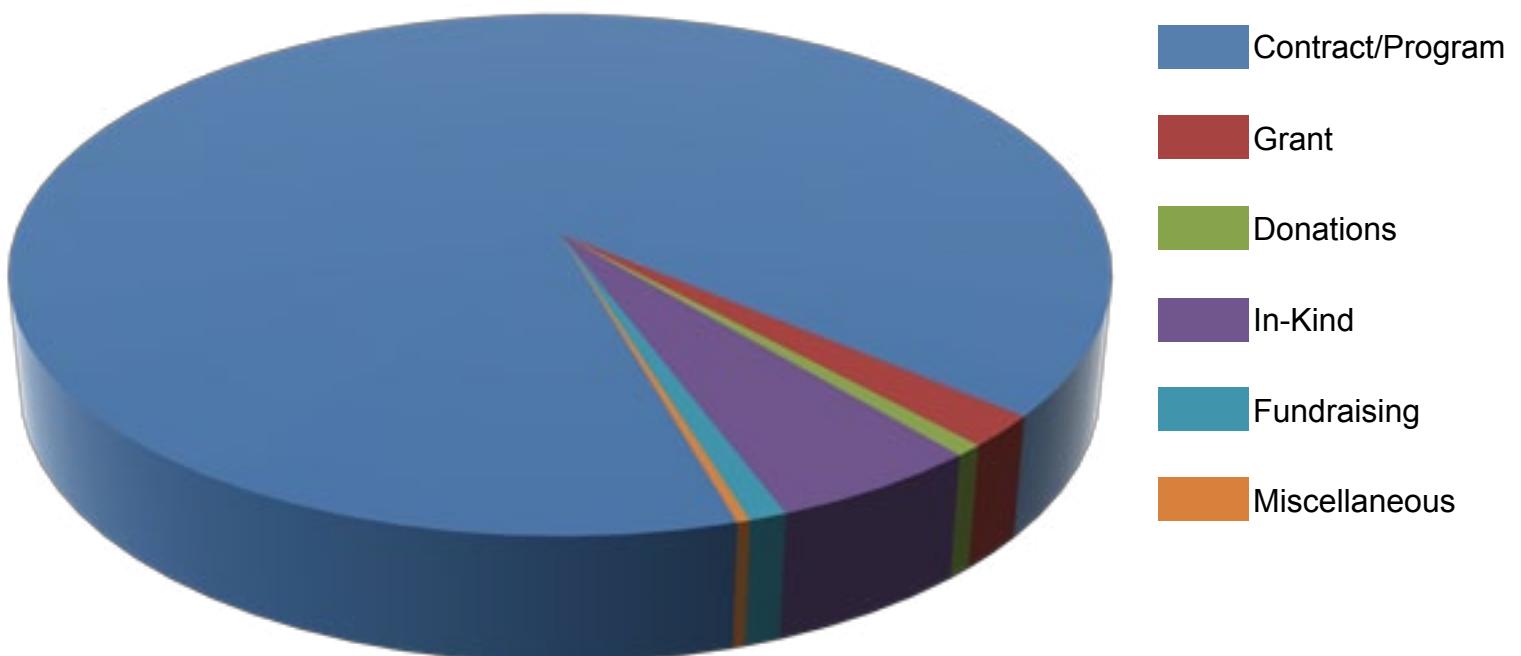
wonderful that as a Care Manager I have the resources available to meet so many different needs for my clients." Tracy loves the camaraderie between all the Care Managers and Supervisors.

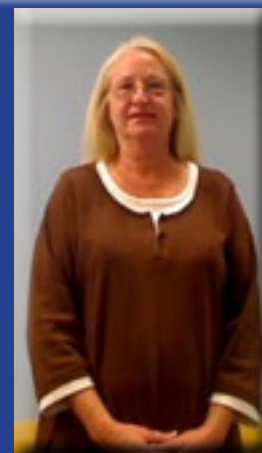
Fiscal Year 2014 Income
