The ADRC is a trusted place where people can turn for information on a full range of long-term support options. As such, it provides an enhanced level of information and

assistance/referral to the community improving their ability to make informed choices. Options Counselors focus on individual needs and preferences by providing information/assistance and referrals to persons seeking solutions to their specific long-term care issues. 5,453 contacts were made through the ADRC. 2,062 were for Options Counseling via telephone or in person.



Care Management

LifeSpan Resources serves as the single entry point into a variety of supportive services for frail older persons and individuals with disabilities who have multiple health care needs. The Care Manager helps identify needs and links persons with home and community-based services so they may remain in the community.

Care Management and Screenings totaled 196,097 units.

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Community-based Care Transition Program

Coaches worked one on one with clients to coordinate their transition

from hospital to home. The goal of the Community-based Care Transition Program was to prevent avoidable hospital readmissions. Clients assisted totaled 696.

Health Facility Pre-Admission Screening

Mandated by state law, this program helps prevent unnecessary



placement in nursing homes of individuals whose long-term care needs can best be met by community services in their own homes. **3,195 applications were processed.**



The Senior Games Gang plays a large part in helping provide services to our clients. The "Gangsters" are Senior Games participants who choose to make a yearly donation in support of our clients and programs. They meet

3 times throughout the year to socialize and compete with each other at Miniature Golf, Cards and Toss'Em.

The Gang is the largest sponsor of Senior Games.

Advocacy

Our agency represents senior citizens through membership in the Human Services Associations and state and national legislative networks. It also sponsors the Golden Hoosier Award, Senior Angel Tree and Senior Games of Indiana. In 2010 the agency launched an Advocacy Committee whose purpose is to act on legislation that affects the elderly and disabled population and/or the agency and its programs.

316 individuals participated in Senior Games and 488 clients were assisted through the Senior Citizens Angel Tree.



Nutrition Program

Provides a hot mid-day meal Monday through Friday to older adults at congregate nutrition sites. Homebound clients receive a frozen 7 pack of meals.

In 2015 we served a total of 239,599 meals:

Preventative Health

Provides monthly health screenings at nutrition sites and periodic educational programs on health topics. 5,305 contacts were made through Health Screenings and Education last year.

2015 Golden Hoosier Volunteer Award

Loren Grahek, of Floyds Knobs, has been named the 2015 Golden Hoosier Volunteer in recognition of her lifetime of volunteer service and



commitment to her community. This award is given by
Lt. Governor Ellspermann and the FSSA Indiana Division of
Aging and is one of the highest honors given by the State of
Indiana to senior citizens. Loren has volunteered for over 43
years in five different states and has been involved with LifeSpan
Resources' Senior Games for 17 years – serving as Chair of the
Decorating Committee for the past 3 years.

Some of Loren's volunteer activities include teaching quilting, crocheting, knitting, decorative artwork, and teaching crafts to adult special needs clients. She also takes Eucharist to nursing home residents weekly, visits homebound individuals, provides scarves & blankets to the homeless, and coordinates food pantry donations for facilities in New Albany and Corydon. An annual quilt show she is involved with raises approximately \$10,000 that is then donated to local organizations. Loren also uses her artistic talent to create banners for numerous groups. Loren, along with other volunteers from across the state, were honored by Lt. Governor Ellspermann and the FSSA Indiana Division of Aging in May at the Indiana Statehouse.

Furnishes transportation to medical appointments, nutrition sites, social service organizations and other locations for persons age 60+ and persons with disabilities. The program is a Medicaid provider for individuals of all ages.

Transportation provided 21,521 trips last year.





LifeSpan Transportation provides service in Clark, Floyd, Harrison and Scott Counties. Our drivers cover 1,413 square miles of territory daily to make sure our clients get to the medical appointments they need.



In-Home Services

The In-Home Services Program provides at risk older persons and persons with disabilities with an array of services to enable them to live independently. Eligibility varies based on funding sources utilized. Care management, attendant care, home delivered meals, adult day care, respite care, homemaker, home health aide, transportation, minor home modifications and adaptive aids and devices are among services provided.

In-Home Services provided 144,558 units last year.

Family Caregiver Program

Connects caregivers to community resources particular to their caregiving needs including Respite Care and other supportive services.


In 2015 the program made 5,436 contacts.
