

LifeSpan Resources Kicks Off 50 Years of Service to the Residents of Clark, Floyd, Harrison and Scott Counties



LifeSpan Resources has been serving senior citizens, and adults and children with disabilities, since 1973, with a mission to provide services that would allow them to live independently for as long as possible.

Our organization has grown from a tiny council


on aging into a \$9.5 million organization, serving over 3,000 clients annually.

In 1972, a local steering committee attended a commission on aging meeting in Indianapolis to learn more about funding for services from the Older Americans Act and to plan the local area agency. The committee studied ways to serve the elderly including providing nutrition and transportation.

In May 1973, the fledgling agency was officially designated an Area Agency on Aging for Area 14 by the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration and was named *South Central Indiana Council for the Aging and the Aged, Inc.* Thelma Bertrand was named the first Executive Director and the agency received an initial planning grant of \$18,000 to establish six senior nutrition sites. Bertrand

retired after 11 years at the helm, having grown the agency to \$2 million and adding several more programs.

After Thelma Bertrand, Pat Jewell-Howard was named the second Executive Director. Over the next ten years the agency experienced explosive growth as more programs were added and services expanded. In 1999, the agency changed its name to LifeSpan Resources, Inc. to reflect the changing demographics of its clientele, which now included a growing number of children. Jewell-Howard retired in 2007. By this time, the agency had grown to \$3.5 million and was in the process of conducting a Capital Campaign to create the new Floyd County YMCA, which would include offices for LifeSpan Resources. 50th Anniversary continued...



Keith Stormes came on board as the third Executive Director in 2008. During his tenure, he oversaw the move from the offices on Bank Street to the new YMCA building on State Street. At this time, the agency also received official designation as an Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) staffed with Options Counselors who provide resources and connections to services for the aging and disabled. Stormes added more programs to the agency during his tenure. Upon retirement in 2017, he left an even larger agency at \$5.7

million.

In 2017, Lora Clark became the agency's fourth leader as CEO. She immediately eliminated all wait lists for services, a huge community benefit that continues today. During her time at the agency, evidence-based health programs have been added to all congregate sites to improve the health and well-being of our attendees. She also began the wildly-popular gala fundraiser, Voice and Vino at the Casino. The gala grew from a \$20,000 fundraiser to well over \$100,000 in five years and continues to grow each year.

Over the years, the agency has fielded requests for help with disaster relief including floods, tornados, winter storms and the granddaddy of them all, the COVID-19 pandemic.

LifeSpan Resources has always been focused on serving people: people who are elderly, frail, alone, in poor health or disabled individuals of any age. And it will always be committed to helping these individuals remain independent and connected in our community. As it looks to the future, the agency sees the importance of providing facilities and programs such as a state of the art senior center to keep people connected and healthy starting at a younger age.

Krekel Rejoins Advisory Council

Sandra Krekel rejoined the LifeSpan Resources Advisory Council during the December meeting. Sandra is a Social Worker and the Medical Foster Home Coordinator at the VA New Albany Clinic.

She previously served a five-year term on the Advisory Council from 2012-2017. Sandra says the Advisory Council will be a great way to stay informed about activities, events and programs that impact her clients—Veterans who are aging and/or chronically ill.

The United Nations General Assembly designated January 27the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau—as International Holocaust Remembrance Day.



February - Black History Month **Celebrates Fredrick Douglass**



"The life of the nation is secure only while the nation is honest, truthful and virtuous."

Fredrick Douglass, American Abolitionist, was born into slavery and became a respected orator, writer, abolitionist, and civil rights leader as well as a presidential consultant to Abra-

ham Lincoln and convinced him that slaves should serve in the union army and abolishment of slavery should be the primary goal of the war. He delivered a speech, "What to the slave is the fourth of July?" so all Americans could reflect on the oppression of black Americans on a day when we all celebrate freedom. Douglass gave this speech in 1852, many years after his escape from slavery. He is also famous for advocating for equality and human rights and the rights of women and is known for saying; "It was hers before she comprehended it. It is inscribed upon all the powers and facilities of her soul, and no custom, law or usage can ever destroy it."




Hart Joins Administrative Team



VALENTINE'S DAY STRAWBERRY HEARTS

How to Make Strawberry Hearts

Equipment

Small, wooden sticks/skewers

Ingredients

- 2 lbs. medium to large fresh strawberries
- 2 cups dark or milk chocolate chips



Instructions:

- 1. Rinse strawberries gently and pat dry.
- 2. With a small, sharp knife, in a circular motion, carve out the stem of the strawberry. See photo to left.
- 3. Slice the strawberry in half.
- 4. At the top of each berry half, cut a small 'V' shape.
- 5. Gently insert wooden stick into the bottom of the heart-shaped strawberry.
- 6. Heat chocolate chips in microwave for 30 seconds. Repeat in 30 second intervals until chocolate chips are melted and smooth.
- 7. Dip strawberries in melted chocolate. Let dry on parchment paper until chocolate completely dries.
- 8. Enjoy with your favorite Valentine!
