2023 HIGHLIGHTS FOR LIFESPAN RESOURCES

Voice and Vino at the Casino: Season Six!

Season Six of our premier gala fundraiser was held on October 24, 2023, once again at Caesars Southern Indiana to a packed house. Guests were entertained by seven singing acts, including two duets (new this year). The event broke our fundraising record and was voted Best Charitable Event by the readers of the *News and Tribune*. Congratulations to Lori Wyatt, our individual winner; and to Diane Williamson and Art Decker - our duet winner.



Senior Games

Seniors were a Rockin' and a Rollin' this year with a 1950s theme for our 37th Annual Senior Games event, held June 5-9. Many thanks to State Representative Ed Clere and Charlestown Mayor Treva Hodges for emceeing our Opening and Closing Ceremonies. Congratulations to our Queen and King: Patricia Howard and Dan Griffin.



- Held our 50th Anniversary Event in May at the IU Southeast Ogle Center, attended by local dignitaries and supporters. It
 presented a new historical video and memorabilia displays. Event was very well received and generated publicity in local
 media.
- Received a State of Indiana House Concurrent Resolution, sponsored by State Rep. Ed Clere, in honor of our 50 years of service to the residents of southern Indiana.
- Partnered with the Floyd County Library History Room to preserve our 50 years of history contained in nine documentary scrapbooks of memorabilia. Scrapbooks are being scanned for digital access to the public, thereby assuring our history will not be lost.
- Produced and ran a schedule of 30-second television ads recognizing our 50 years of service in the area. Ads were seen
 by many and were very well received. First time in history we have run a television campaign.
- 🗕 Ran a well-received "50 Reasons to Love LifeSpan Resources" social media campaign.
- Received NCQA three-year Re-Accreditation for our Case Management program, thus positioning us favorably as we transition to managed care of Medicaid Waiver clients beginning in 2024.
- Started offering the Produce for Better Health (PBH) Program in partnership with IAAAA and the Anthem Foundation.
 Program provides a twice-monthly box of fresh produce year round to congregate participants.
- Broke all prior fundraising records with Voice and Vino Season 6, bringing in \$150,000
- Received three new vans for the Rides To Go! program.
- Brought in a total of \$500,000 in grant funds for Transportation, Nutrition, Health and Wellness, and Technology needs.
 Received funding from FSSA and hired a new Health and Wellness Coordinator to bring more evidence-based programs to the community.

- Received funding from FSSA and hired a new Dementia Care Coach, providing support for caregivers and case managers dealing
 with individuals experiencing various forms of dementias.
- Hired case managers that are multi-lingual.
- Seniors Rocked and Rolled their way through our 37th annual Senior Games (Theme of the '50s in celebration of our 50th Anniversary). Held Opening and Closing in a new and well received venue: Eastern Heights Baptist Church. 175 seniors participated and the event brought in nearly \$46,000 in fundraising.
- Awarded \$1.097M American Rescue Plan (ARP) Grant Funds to provide programs and services to maintain the health & well-being
 of older Hoosiers and Caregivers during & after COVID-19.
- Offered the new Rock of Ages Program at Maxwell's House of Music to our Congregate participants, Senior Games Gang members, volunteers and others age 60+. Many received music training for the first time in their lives and all participants got to be in a band and perform on stage.
- Said Goodbye to our Fifth Street location which was operated by LSR for 40 years as a small senior center, congregate center, transportation offices and later to Nutrition and case management offices. LSR thanked the City of New Albany for the use of the facility over the years. This move allowed us to consolidate staff in our main office at the YMCA, thereby saving the substantial annual expenses of maintaining a century+ old building.
- Hosted six Blood Drives, continuing our long tradition of support and recognition of this very great need.
- Sent five employees through leadership training programs with Leadership Southern Indiana, continuing our record of consistent support and involvement with this important program in our community.
- Conducted a successful Vendor Fair in May with full participation the first in four years.
- Held our second annual Employee Picnic in September at Kevin Hammersmith Park. The picnic was well attended with families
 and children and generated a lot of good will amongst employees and leadership staff.
- LSR voted best In- Home Service Provider and Best Provider of Disability Services by the readers of the News and Tribune.
- Voice and Vino voted Best Charitable Event by the readers of the News and Tribune.
- Joined the Community Care Hub of Indiana as a board member in anticipation of the MLTSS (Managed Care Long Term Services and Supports) transition beginning next year.
- Completed participation in the Leverage Program funded by Metro United Way, collaborating with Spalding University to review our hiring practices and agency policies and procedures through a DEI (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion) lens. Program determined our proactive efforts were exceptional.

CASE MANAGEMENT

LifeSpan Resources serves as the single entry point into a variety of supportive services for older adults and individuals with disabilities to remain independent. Our state certified and highly trained case managers identify needs, link clients with home and community-based services and create person-centered care plans.

3,492 clients received Case Management for a total of 42,915 hours of service provided.

IN-HOME SERVICES

We coordinate many in-home services that allow our clients to remain living safely in the homes they cherish. These services include:

179,227 units of In-Home services were provided.



LifeSpan Resources provides care transition services to hospital patients with an Indiana Managed Care Organization. These patients are at high risk for readmission to the hospital. Our Managed Care Options Counselors work closely with the patients' nurse case managers to educate patients and connect them to resources needed for safe transitions from hospital to home.




FAMILY CAREGIVER PROGRAM

This program connects caregivers to community resources particular to their needs including Respite Care, Caregiver Education and other supportive services

LEGAL SERVICES

LifeSpan Resources offers legal services to persons age 60 and over through a partnership with a local attorney.

673 hours of Legal Services were provided.



NUTRITION PROGRAM

LifeSpan Resources *Meals to Go!* program provides weekly delivery of seven-meal boxes to people who are homebound, who no longer cook, who have no family members to provide groceries, can't afford to buy enough food, live in food deserts, or other reasons. Meals are planned by a registered dietician to be well balanced and tasty; and provide 1/3 of the daily dietary requirements. Mastersons of Louisville, Kentucky, is our caterer for this program; their drivers also deliver the meals.

55,497 meals were provided through Meals to Go!



PREVENTATIVE HEALTH

Health screenings, nutrition education programs, music, arts and crafts, games and a host of other socialization activities, along with evidence-based wellness programs are offered throughout the year at our congregate centers and other community locations.

299 health screenings were provided 1,242 units of evidence-based wellness programming were provided 15,426 units of nutrition education and socialization were provided





PRODUCE FOR BETTER HEALTH

This innovative new program offered in partnership with IAAAA, the Anthem Foundation and Indiana University, provides bi-weekly boxes of fresh produce to our congregate clients to take home and enjoy. This is a "Food as Medicine" program that researches the health effects of consuming more fresh produce.

CONGREGATE NUTRITION

Our local congregate nutrition centers offer a daily hot lunch, socialization activities and games, evidence-based wellness programs and nutrition education.

TRANSPORTATION

We offer several transportation programs including medical and social transportation and transport to adult day programs. All vehicles are equipped to transport individuals in wheelchairs safely and comfortably. All drivers are background and drug and alcohol tested, CPR and first aid certified, and trained in safe transport. They are the most caring drivers – offering door-through-door assistance and safe delivery of clients to and from their destinations.

8,919 medical trips were provided. 9,085 social trips were provided. 18,003 total trips were provided


